WRJ: Presence in Latin America



- In the celebrations of its Centennial, Rabbi Karina Finkielsztein, from Fundación Judaica, Argentina, was one of the invited speakers.
- She emphasized the advancement of the status of women in Judaism worldwide, and underscored the challenges faced by communities in Latin America to accept and recognize the presence of female religious leaders.
- It was on this occasion that Dora Lucia Brenner, representing the Congregação Israelita Paulista –CIP/Brazil, officiated the first group, in Latin America affiliated to WRJ, referred to as "Shiriat Miriam", which is currently coordinated by **Ruth Bohm**.
- In this monthly group women and men study Judaism from a feminist perspective enriching the Jewish narrative of women's inclusion in the community and religious leadership position.
- Another study group named "she-asani isha" was formed in Buenos
 Aires, Argentina, under leadership of Rabbi Karina Finkelstein and
 Susana Perlman. This group is working on gender identity issue.


Mifgash TaMaR in Connections 2015




- 3rd. Mifgash of <u>TaMaR</u>, dedicated to *Tikun Olam*, and combined study with visits to inspiring projects.
- Thirty five young adults from Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Germany, Israel, Panama, Poland, Russia, Spain, UK, USA.
- Besides other sponsorship, 10 young adults sponsored by WRJ
- Our visits featured trips to *Tikun Olam* projects that will enable us to see things through the eyes of the *cariocas* Jewish organizations:
 - Favela do Vigário Geral
 - Eliezer Max School
 - Favela Dona Marta
 - Hillel Rio de Janeiro/ Coexistence Project
- Study sessions included panels and *chevrutot* (learning in pairs):
 - We questioned the relevance of our ancient and modern Jewish sources and their pervasive influence on our lives.
 - We analyzed the wide breadth of interpretations by which we analyze our sources and their messages.
 - In addition, we will try to understand Jewish ethics and their application in our daily lives.

Mifgash TaMaR









- The WUPJ-LA began the translation of the Chumash into Portuguese.
- The Chumash is composed of Moses' five books in the Torah as well as the Haftarot, texts written and inspired by the prophets.
- This project was idealized by Rabbi Gunther Plaut to offer an alternative for the progressive congregations. In the United States, the Chumash in English is a great success in almost one thousand congregations.
- One of the main objectives of the WUPJ in making this translation into Portuguese is to provide for the Brazilian Jewish community a book with interpretations in a modern, interesting and attractive language, which identifies with a egalitarian, inclusive and modern manifestation of Judaism.

Training Programs in Israel: Lay Leadership Training



- Programs for educators, activists, community and youth leaders within the International Organization's annual program of events. Important the presence of more women scholars as well as materials published by WRJ.
- We have encouraged the participation and sent representatives from Latin America chosen using defined criteria. These programs work to motivate people to continue their involvement in Jewish community life.
- Building a solid progressive Jewish community in Latin America begins with having a solid core of Jewish professionals, emphasizing lay leaders training and educators.
- This program often leads to sending some of these people to Jerusalem for additional study at the Saltz Center.

Future actions / WRJ & WUPJ-LA



How to be more effective in future actions using the structure of the two institutions:

- Ruth Bohm, lay leader from Congregação Israelita Paulista CIP – São Paulo is the elected WRJ liaison in Latin America to reinforce the projects in the region.
- Elect a WRJ representative in each Congregation to develop programs.
- Replicate the Rosh Chodesh experience to other WUPJ-LA affiliates
- Implement participation of lay leaders and professionals to attend WRJ Conferences- London in April
- Invite Women Scholars to participate of Educational program Scholar in Residence - that takes place once an year in LA
- Provide financial support to the existing projects: Chumash Plaut
- Provide materials to congregations
- Twinning Programs
- Organize a trip to Israel with leaders representatives- Saltz Institute WUPJ and WRJ
